

Previous symposia included a discussion on how we can close the treatment gap for osteoporosis, controversial issues in osteoporosis, evidence-based management of osteoporosis and a panel discussion on FRAX, combination therapy and the role of vertebroplasty or kyphoplasty.

Clinical Breakfast as ASBMR

The ASBMR 2017 Clinical Breakfast (with CME) will be supported by multiple companies.
