Human and Economic Impact of Osteoporosis and Bone Breaks

1/2

of women and up to 1/4 of men over age 50 will break a bone due to osteoporosis

After a fracture,



4 out of 5 women over 67 are not tested or treated for osteoporosis

Every year, of nearly 300,000 hip fracture patients

1/4 end up in nursing homes

and

1/2 never regain previous function

Over **1/3**

of patients with a hip fracture had a prior fracture

50%

of osteoporosis-related repeat fractures can be prevented with appropriate treatments

Osteoporosis fractures will likely cost us

\$25 billion per year

by 2025
